You see the Saint who is hugging everybody without saying a word and the lines to hug her are so long. Why? The way of the heart. It silences the mind, renders the intellect question-less, dumbfounds the intellect with its power - the power of the heart. Love conquers all. Love is God. Love is divine. Love is a joyous way to the Self.

The goal is to learn how to love without condition, and to all those who have the temperament of the heart, it is their balm, elixir, tonic, the purifier. They loved the Master dearly and stayed with the practice and it provided such a powerful field of the Master. The field impacted me; it opened my heart. And for the first time I could feel a love that was beyond human and beyond conditionality, but coming first from within myself. Before I could feel it in another, I needed to feel it within my own being.

That is why I am such a follower of love. No matter how wise my mind makes me, love draws me into its fold. It nourishes me. I go to bed in the consciousness of love, simply because my body is nourished by it. I meet people in the field of love because love can lift any space, can heal any sorrow. Love is magical. I am a servant of love. I wish we could all understand the secret of love.

Community Outreach Events in January and February

To start off the new year, Blue Star members gathered together to lend a hand at two major food banks located in Toronto and Ottawa.

<u>Toronto</u>

On Saturday, January 19th, a group of 10 of our Toronto members turned out to help at the Daily Bread Food Bank situated in the Etobicoke area. The Daily Bread charity is one of the largest food banks in the country, helping to feed many thousands of low-income people every year.

All of us worked together to sort donated foods into categories and boxes so that they could then be shipped to more than 200 programs for people across the City. Upon arriving, all of us were quick to roll up our sleeves, assume a role and work efficiently to accomplish the task at hand.

Those participating seemed to enjoy working as part of the team to help address, in some way, a significant and growing need. It was good to get together and share some fun while supporting a valuable cause and furthering Blue Star's outreach work in the broader community. The consensus seemed to be that this was a volunteer activity definitely worth repeating in years to come.



Ottawa

On February 8th, a few of us from Blue Star Ottawa volunteered at the Ottawa Food Bank warehouse, a volunteer opportunity that was organized by the Blue Star Canada Board. There we met a wonderful young lady named Anne who briefed us before we started because it was the first time that Donelda, Judy and I had volunteered there. Our role was to unpack and check donated food received in the warehouse for best before dates/expiry dates on each item as well as for the condition of the food packages and cans, and then to sort the items into roughly 30 different categories by placing them in the appropriately labeled bins. This process ensures that at the Food Bank Headquarters they always know exactly what they have on their shelves, and what they may still need, so that it can be distributed to the 114 local agencies who help feed 38,400 people per month. Surprisingly, 36% of the clients are children.

The Ottawa Food Bank not only works with local farmers and accepts fresh produce donations

but it also grows food in season on their own plot of land that was donated to them, resulting in 43% of the food they deliver being fresh. In addition, it spends roughly \$1.6 million a year on food to ensure they are able to keep up with demand and make certain they are providing a variety of nutritious and balanced options. This is made possible by cash donations.

We all agreed that we learned something, that we enjoyed the experience, and that we would definitely consider volunteering there again. I found that we worked really well as a team and that the time flew by really fast!

It was a great way to spend time together, and I was pleased that we, as Blue Star members, were able to give back to our community in some small measure through this volunteer activity.
